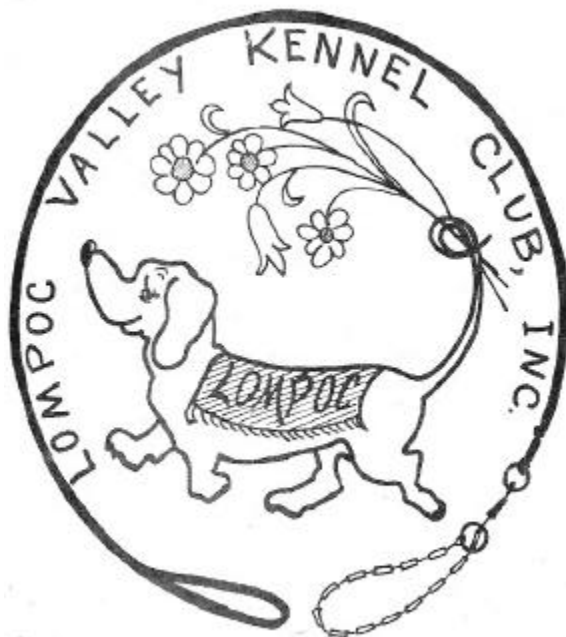

RAMP

At the discretion of the judge, the following breeds may be judged on a ramp: Clumber Spaniels, Sussex Spaniels, Whippets, Irish Terriers, Kerry Blue Terriers, Soft Coated Wheaten Terriers, Staffordshire Bull Terriers, Bulldogs, Chinese Shar-Pei, Chow Chows, Keeshonden, Polish Lowland Sheepdogs and Xoloitzcuintli. Basset Hounds are expected to be judged on a ramp. Ramps may be used in emergency situations to judge any breed. (In an emergency situation, an exhibitor does have the option of withdrawing their entry and receiving a refund.)

Dogs need only be present for the judging of their breed. Dogs not needed for further judging may be excused.

No dogs owned or co-owned by a member of the Club or by a member's immediate family may be entered in these shows, and members of the Club shall not exhibit or act as handler at these shows.

BEST OF BREED (VARIETY) COMPETITION

Best of Breed (Variety) Competition - "The following categories of dogs may be entered in this competition: Dogs that are Champions of Record. Dogs which according to their owners' records have completed the requirements for a championship but whose championships are unconfirmed. The showing of dogs whose championships are unconfirmed is limited to a period of 90 days from the date of show where a dog completed the requirements for a championship according to the owners' records.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES, INVOLVING MULTIPLE DOG ENTRIES

Stud Dog Class - For dogs that have sired two get entered in this show. The award will be based on the merits of the get. The owner of the stud dog need not be the owner of the get. As the judge's decision in this class will be based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, no one of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged first in the class, will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won this class. The Stud Dog must appear in the ring with his get and be entered in the Stud Dog Class.

Brood Bitch Class - Same as Stud Dog, except change Stud Dog to Brood Bitch; get to produce.

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP COMPETITION

The Lumpoc Valley Kennel Club offers an award for Best Junior Handler.

Novice Junior Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 9 years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have not won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Novice Intermediate Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 12 years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have not won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Novice Senior Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 15 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have not won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Junior Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 9 years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Intermediate Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 12 years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Senior Class: For Boys and Girls who are at least 15 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Place awards with competition present in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Each dog handled in a Junior Showmanship Class must be entered in one of the Breed or Obedience Classes at the show, or must be entered for Junior Showmanship only. However, a dog may be substituted. Such substitution must be accompanied by an official AKC entry form. All such substitutions must be made one half-hour prior to the judging of any Junior Showmanship Classes at the show. Each dog must be owned or co-owned by the Junior Handler or by the Junior Handler's father, mother, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, grandfather or grandmother, including step and half relations or by a member of the Junior Handler's household. Every dog entered for Junior Showmanship must be eligible to compete in Dog Shows or in Obedience Trials. BITCHES IN SEASON ARE NOT ELIGIBLE. A dog that has been excused or disqualified by a Breed Judge or by a Bench Show Committee may still be handled in Junior Showmanship if eligible to compete in Obedience Trials. A dog that has been rejected, dismissed, or excused by the Veterinarian for the protection of the other dogs at the show or for the protection of the dog excused may not be handled in Junior Showmanship.

Junior Handlers who win a third Novice Class with competition present after the closing of entries for a show may transfer their entry from the Novice Class to the Open Class provided that this transfer is made by the Superintendent at least one half-hour prior to the scheduled start of any regular conformation judging or one half-hour prior to the scheduled start of Junior Showmanship judging at the show, whichever is earlier.

Winning of first place in an Open Class at this show may qualify or count toward qualification for entry in certain future limited Junior Showmanship Classes. For information on eligibility requirements for limited Junior Showmanship Classes which have been approved to date by AKC, write to the American Kennel Club, 5580 Centerview Drive #200, Raleigh, NC 27606.

Junior Handler's must include their AKC Junior Handler identification number on the entry blank.

You may obtain your number by calling the AKC Event Records Department (919) 816-3776.

ADDITIONAL RULES

1. Entries must reach the Superintendent, Jack Bradshaw, 5434 East Olympic Boulevard, Los Angeles CA, 90022, by Noon, Wednesday July 8, 2009 PDT. Fees should accompany entries. This club and/or its superintendent assumes no responsibility for wrong or incomplete information given on the entry blank by the owner or agent of the owner. This club and its superintendents assume no responsibility for the owner or owner's agents entering a dog in a class in which the dog is not eligible to compete, or for entering the same dog twice.
2. Returned Checks do not constitute a valid entry fee. The Superintendent will add a collection fee to the amount of each returned check and declined credit card. Subsequent returned checks for the same exhibitors may result in their being put on a CASH ONLY basis. The returned check or credit card MUST BE MADE GOOD by cash or money order BEFORE the dog will be allowed in the ring.
3. Exhibitors' Identification tickets and judging programs will be mailed to the address given on the entry blank. If not received within a reasonable time prior to the show, notify the superintendent. Tickets returned by the Post Office marked 'undeliverable' will be held at the Superintendent's Office. PLEASE BRING YOUR IDENTIFICATION TICKETS TO THE SHOW.
4. During the hours of judging owners are to be on call, and have their dogs ready to bring into the judging ring promptly, in order that the judging will not be delayed. Dogs need only be present for their judging. Dogs not needed for further judging may be excused. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have his dog ready to be shown and at the entrance of the judging ring when the steward calls for the class. Owners of dogs or the handlers of the dogs alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in the judging rings. This means it is not the responsibility of the ring steward, nor of any agent of the show-giving club to locate any dog, its owner or handler, when the dog's presence is needed in a judging ring. It should be understood by every exhibitor and handler that waiting for dogs to be brought into the ring is a courtesy extended to the owner or handler of the dog. There is no rule of this club nor of The American Kennel Club that requires a judge to wait for an owner or handler to bring his dog into the ring. Show hours 7 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
5. Trophies and prizes will be awarded in the judging ring before the completion of the judging of the breed and the superintendent's office advised at once, in the event of any discrepancy. All trophies must be claimed the day of the show. None will be mailed.
6. Exhibitors are admonished to make themselves familiar with the agreement of the American Kennel Club, referred to on the reverse side of the entry blanks that accompany this premium list. Rule books are available at the Superintendent's table at the shows or may be obtained from the A.K.C., 5580 Centerview Drive #200, Raleigh, NC 27606.
7. The club, its superintendents or their employees will not be responsible for the loss of or damage to any dog exhibited, whether the result of accident or other causes and in addition assumes no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by an exhibitor or handler. It is distinctly understood that every dog at this show is in the care and custody and control of his owner or handler during the entire time the dog is on the show premises.
8. No grooming tables, pens or exhibitors setups will be allowed in the aisles and all grooming must be done away from the judging ring in areas specified by the club.
9. Entry fees shall NOT be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, sick, lame, excused by veterinarian or judge, barred from competition by action of the Bench Show Committee, or because the dog is ineligible to compete due to being entered incorrectly. There is no refund of entry fee for duplicate entry. There will be a \$2.00 fee charged for cancellation of entry prior to closing of entries.
10. There is no provision offered for unentered dogs at this show.
11. Declination of Entries. The Lompoc Valley Kennel Club may decline any entries for cause and may refuse to receive or may remove any dog on account of disease, viciousness or other causes, and no one shall have any claim or recourse against the Kennel Club or any official thereof.
12. If, because of riots, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of the management, it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refund of entry will be made.
13. Do not leave any dogs in closed vehicles.
14. A Recording Fee of 50 cents and an Event Services Fee of \$3.00 will be required at any Licensed or Member Club Show, Obedience Trial or Tracking Test. These fees are to be collected by the Show-giving Club and paid to the American Kennel Club. (American Kennel Club Rule, Chapter 11, Section 2.)
15. Dogs which according to their owners' records have completed the requirements for a championship after the closing of entries for the show but whose championships are unconfirmed, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to the Best of Breed or Variety Competition, provided this transfer is made by the Superintendent at least one half hour prior to the start of the earliest Conformation judging at the Show.
16. Junior Handlers who win a third Novice Class after the Closing of entries for a show may transfer their entry from the Novice Class to the Open Class provided that this transfer is made by the Superintendent at least one half-hour prior to the scheduled start of the earliest conformation judging or one half-hour prior to the scheduled start of Junior Showmanship judging at the Show, whichever is earlier.
17. No practicing in the rings.
18. Parents and/or guardians are responsible for the actions of their children.

OVERNIGHT PARKING

Wednesday, Thursday, Friday & Saturday

All reserved overnight parking with electrical hookups is \$80.00 per night. There is no provision for Tuesday or Sunday night parking. To conserve parking space, two or three vans or small vehicles may share a space for the price of one, as long as no infringement into the fire lanes or adjacent spaces occurs. The multiple permits will be sent to the person making the reservation. All reserved spaces are numbered. Any vehicles over 40' in length will be required to unhook or buy two spaces. Any trailers or 5th wheels parked on the asphalt will be required to unhook.

ELECTRICAL SERVICE: Event Power Solutions will provide electrical service, 50 amp power can be available in advance for \$80.00 per night with 2 nights minimum. Power on at 5:00 pm Thursday and off at 5:00 pm Sunday. Sharing of power is prohibited. Electrical is included with all parking reservations.

LIMITED Overnight parking without power will be by reservation only at \$40.00 per night.

DAY OF SHOW PARKING: The church lot west of the park is available for overflow and general parking at the rate of \$5.00 per vehicle. **PARKING IS NOT PERMITTED IN THE CHURCH PARKING LOT. PLEASE ABIDE BY THE CHURCH'S REQUEST.**

OVERNIGHT HANDICAPPED PARKING: Limited Handicapped parking is available at the regular rates. Proof of handicapped required with reservation.

RESERVED PARKING LOTS WILL OPEN Wednesday evening at approximately 5:00 p.m. and will close at 10:00 P.M. THURSDAY, FRIDAY, SATURDAY AND SUNDAY. Parking will be open 6 to 8 AM and 2 to 11 PM. All vehicles must be self-contained. All pens must be set up within the show grounds. Dogs must be confined to motorhomes after 10:00 p.m. **There will be no parking in the 100 block of South "O" Street. This is designated "NO PARKING". Violators will be ticketed.** Unloading zone is provided at entrance to the parking lot. Overnight reservations are strictly at the exhibitor's own risk. Lompoc Valley Kennel Club, the Western Sighthound Combined Specialties and/or the City of Lompoc do not assume any responsibility for personal injury, fire, theft, damage or loss of any personal property while on the Show Grounds.

Reservations must be received by July 8, 2009. People wishing to park together must send reservations together. THERE WILL BE NO REFUNDS AFTER CLOSING DATE.

Exhibitors arriving before Thursday may park at River Park. There are hook-ups and a dumping station. River Park is located at the east end of Lompoc off Highway 246. There are 2 gas stations that sell propane, one at 3rd and Ocean, the other at H Street and North Avenue.
